Armadillo Youth Cafe and Venue, a £1.5 M facility which is open 7 days per week - all year round. Developed in partnership with South Gloucestershire Council. Now solely owned and operated by Yate TC after SG Council stopped its financial contribution. The Town Council also finances and directs the Youth Out Reach Service based on the "Urbie" a van fully equipped for Youth use.

Yate Outdoor Sports Complex. Started by Yate TC and expanded with support first by Northavon District Council and then with Avon CC (both merged into South Gloucestershire Council). For a while run (down) by SG Council - the Town Council has taken on full responsibility for YOSC and has now put a new all-weather track in place and has completely relayed an all-weather hockey/football pitch

Kingsgate Park, originally South Gloucestershire run, the Town Council has taken it over in exchange for reduction of Special Expenses Council Tax for the Town. Working with a Friends Group the Council has provided a very large Adventure Play Area; up graded other play equipment. An Outdoor Gym has been added. The TC provides Annual music festival (Yate Rocks) with local bands and dance groups; Easter Egg hunt and other events in the Park.
