To whom it may concern

On behalf of officers in the Planning and Democratic Services departments at Stratford District Council I am pleased to add our endorsement to the nomination of the Clerk of Kineton Parish Council for the NALC Star Council Clerk of the Year Award.

During the time that Ms Gina Lowe has been in the post of Clerk we have seen many well researched and validated responses to Planning Application consultations. Two of them have led to hearings before Planning Inspectors at which the Parish Council provided robust representation. One of these has now been withdrawn and the other, as a direct result of her input, is with the Secretary of State for decision.

Ms Lowe has also been actively involved with the development of a Neighbourhood Plan, culminating in a referendum for which the District Council was responsible. In the final days before the referendum Ms Lowe researched the relevant legislation, conclusively demonstrating that the Parish Council was not the subject of purdah regulations (which had previously been thought to apply) and furthermore that it was necessary for the District Council to issue clarification against misleading information circulated by opponents to the Plan, despite itself being covered by purdah regulations.

We wish Gina luck with her nomination.
