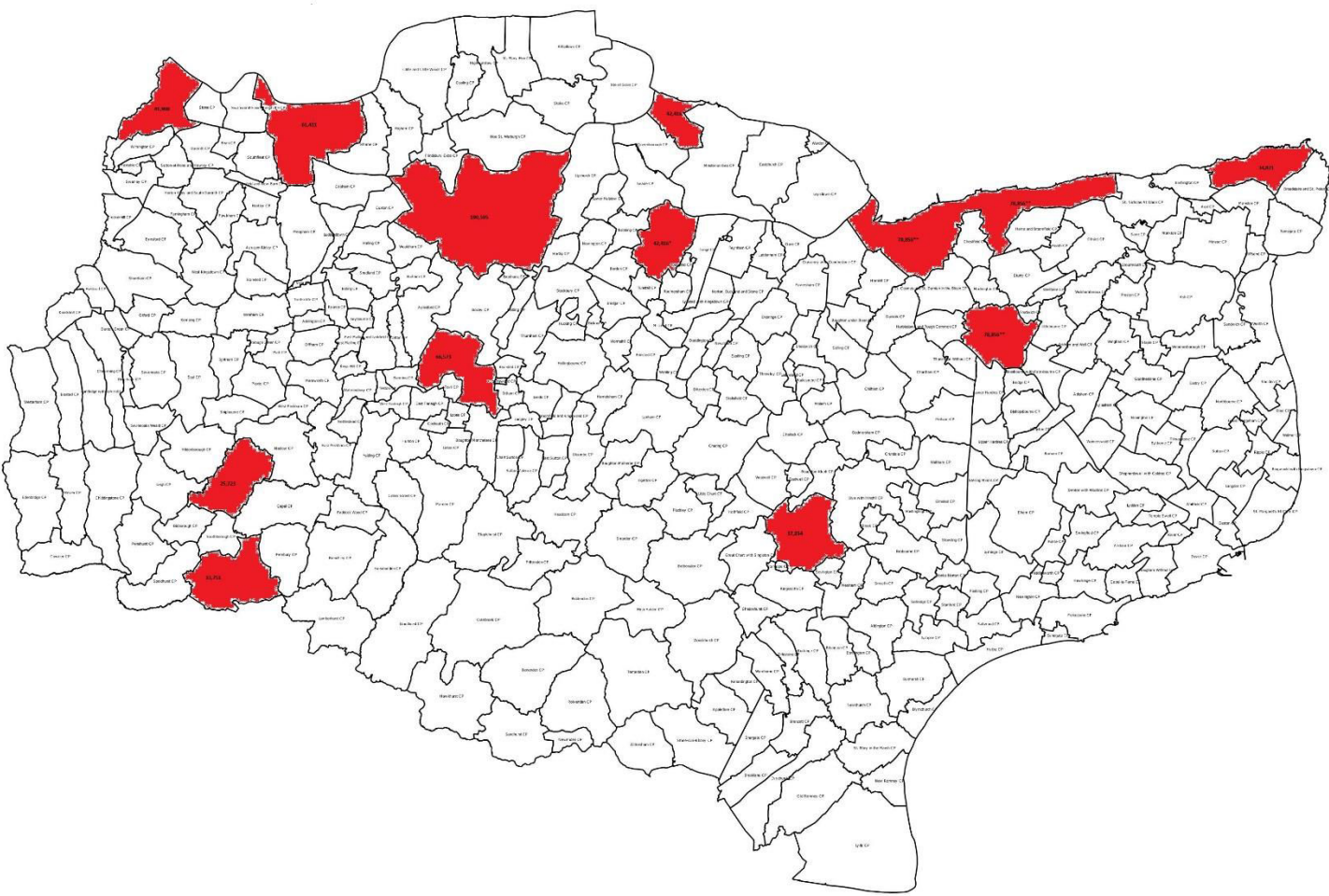

Community groups launch fight for more local rights

Petition seeks devolution of some council powers

A CAMPAIGN to give power to the people by creating community councils has been launched by four groups in Ashford.

Kennington, central Ashford, north Willborough and south Willborough community forums are joining forces to petition for the creation of community councils.

Chairman of Kennington Community Forum Chris Morley said: "In the rural areas of Ashford we have parish councils but in the urban areas, we have nothing smaller than the borough council."

"That means if you want a playground in your area refurbished or a streetlight fixed, you have to apply to the borough council who will be considering similar requests from across the borough."

A community council, like a parish or town council, would be able to raise money through a council tax precept which would be ring-fenced for spending on local projects. The average precept for parish or town councils in the Ashford borough is £26 per year.

Mr Morley added: "It would have a big impact on local democracy. We would have legal rights to comment on planning applications in the area, for example."

The forums, all run by volunteers, decided to work together to

look in to the possibility of starting community councils after the Government made money available through its New Councils Programme in September 2013.

In December the forums successfully won a grant of £18,000 to fund the campaign under the New Councils Programme, and are receiving advice and support from the Kent Association of Local Councils (KALC).

Signatures

The first aim of the forums is to collect enough signatures of support from residents to trigger a community governance review by Ashford Borough Council. A total of ten per cent of the electorate are needed to support the application for this to happen.

With a total of about 40,000 people living in the areas affected, each petition needs around a thousand signatures.

If successful, this could lead to the creation of four community councils by May 2015. Members would be elected or co-opted according to election procedures.

Campaign Progress

- **Community Governance Review undertaken:**
 - South Willesborough and Newtown – petition submitted – 26.3% turnout – **54.6% YES** – 45.4% NO
 - North Willesborough – valid petition submitted - 33.1% turnout – 44.2% Yes - 55.8% NO
 - Kennington – valid petition submitted - 34.9% turnout – **53.3% YES** – 46.7% NO
 - Central Ashford – 28.6% turnout – 39% YES – 61% NO
 - South Ashford – 26.1% turnout – 37.8% YES – 62.2% NO
- **Verification of Petition Signatures**
 - **Rochester**
 - submitted petition on 7 October 2015 (92%)
 - Re-submitted petition on 12 May 2016

Ashford Campaign Outcome

- **2 new Community Councils from 2019:**
 - South Willesborough and Newtown
 - Kennington
- KALC continuing to engage with the 3 other campaign areas

Lessons Learnt



- Tackling the additional tier of Local Government and additional costs issues – public perception
- Leaflet delivery
- Local Politics
- Online petitions
- Maintaining momentum from petition to CGR consultation
- Sharing the load amongst the campaign group
- Use of social media
- Active website
- Street Canvassing – high street, outside Doctor's Surgery, Local Primary School
- Local media – e.g. local radio and local press
- Car stickers, pens etc
- Linking principal authority with good practice elsewhere
