

FACTS AND FIGURES


- 61% of local councils employ 1 clerk
- 65% of local councils employ 1 clerk for up to 15 hours a week
- 54% of local councils serve a population of less than 2,000
- On average there were 2 councillor vacancies per local council over the past twelve months
- 73% of local councils raised a precept of less than £100k
- 2.9% raised a precept of over £1 million
- 22% of local councils increased their precept by less than 1.99%
- 51% of local councils increased their precept by more than 2%
- 60% of local councils do not solely rely on the precept




2017/18 Precept




Other Sources of Funding




Directly Delivering and Participating in Service Delivery




Sources of Funding (By Type/5 Year Period)

CROWDFUNDING


"Crowdfunding is the practice of funding a project by raising small amounts of money from many people, typically via the internet. It is a form of crowdsourcing and of alternative finance. In 2015, it was estimated that worldwide over £25 billion was raised this way. This modern model of sourcing funds is based on three component parts:

- 1. the project owner who proposes the idea;
- 2. individuals or groups who support the idea;
- 3. a moderating organisation (the 'platform') that brings the parties together to launch the idea.

Crowdfunding has been used to fund a wide range for-profit entrepreneurial ventures such as artistic and creative projects as well as community-oriented social projects."


