- One that recognises the great diversity of individuals with dementia and their carers
- Promotes their inclusion in all areas of community life
- Respects their decisions and lifestyle choices
- Anticipates and responds flexibly to their dementia related needs and preferences

What people with dementia and their families can say

- I live in an enabling environment where I feel valued and understood
- I have a sense of belonging and feel a valued part of family, community and civic life

What we did

- Set up a committee
- Formed a fully constituted group
- Sourced funding
- Sourced a host employer
- Employed a project coordinator
- Became employers

We can't change the person with dementia but we can change the experience they have within their own community

What do we do?

- Direct work with families
- Community work

How we do it

- Find out what people need to stay active and involved in community life
- Give encouragement and ongoing support
- Be a point of contact for people
- Remain involved with families throughout their journey
- Liaise with voluntary agencies, GP's, other health and social care professionals and schools
- Hold public awareness raising sessions
- Create bespoke sessions targeting community groups, businesses and organisations
