On 4 May, Farnham voters will be invited to take part in a referendum in which they will be asked whether they wish Waverley Borough Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Farnham. The referendum is a legal requirement and is taking place alongside the County Council elections.

The results of both the election and referendum will be available on Waverley Borough Council's website by the weekend.

A week after the election, Farnham Town Councillors will elect a new Mayor of Farnham. We will publish full details about the new Mayor on our website on Friday 12 May.

Finally, May is festival month. We are holding our first ever Walking Festival from 21 to 28 May and on 28 May our Spring Festival will mark the start of our summer programme of activities.

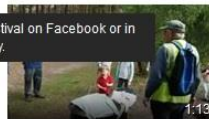

Allotment Newsletter

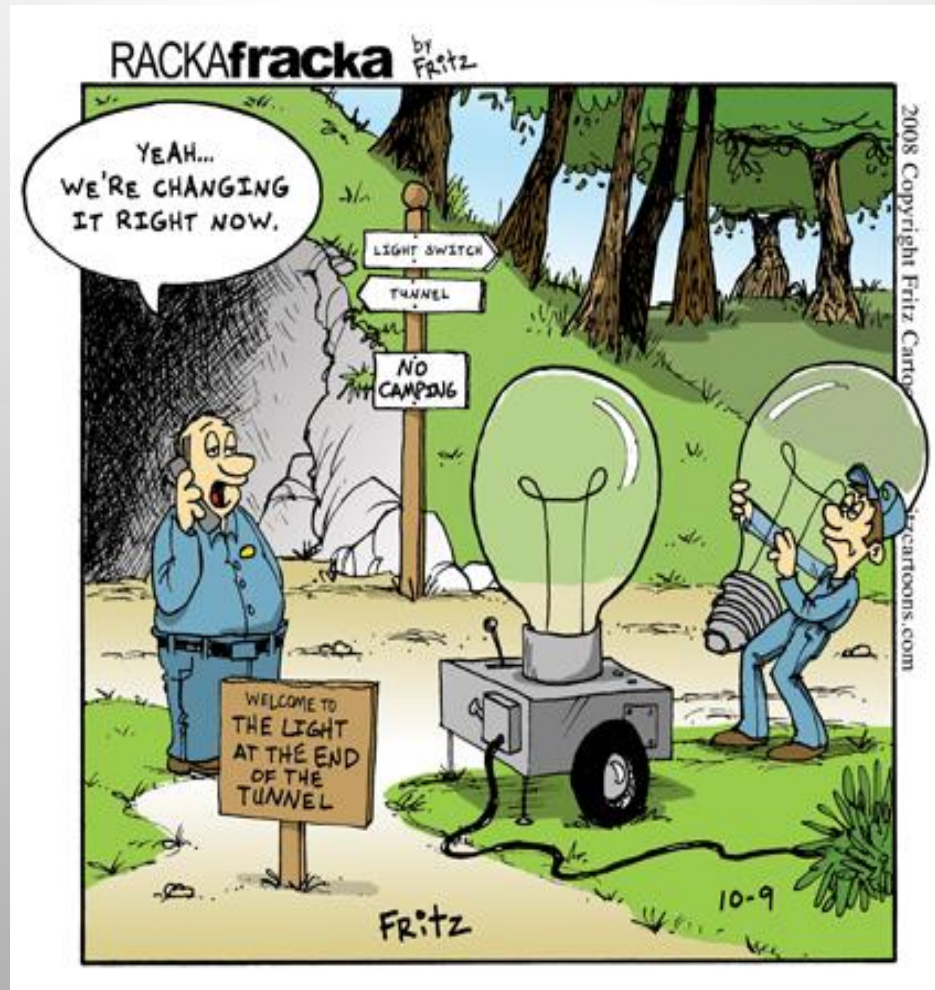
Springing into action...

Firstly, a warm welcome to the many new allotment holders that have taken on plots since our last newsletter. It is always hard work when you take on a new allotment but advice is always available from other allotment holders or the Farnham Town Council team. Please call if you are not sure about something or need advice on what to grow, where to grow it or varieties to use. If you have just taken on an allotment try to get down to your plot daily for half an hour or weekly for 2.5 hours. By doing this you will keep on top of the weeds and also keep an eye on pests and diseases. You do need to be on the plot regularly otherwise your plantings soon get overrun by weeds, and slugs and snails will have somewhere to hide!

This is an extremely busy time of year on the allotment, with seed sowing and putting out plants. Spring this year has been on the chilly side and very dry, with night frosts and a cold wind, so don't get caught out with early sowings. Despite this, everything is growing really quickly, including weeds.

Please be watchful, as frost can still occur until the end of May so have something handy such as a fleece to cover up any tender plants. If your potatoes are coming through, earth them up to protect them from a late frost. For those who don't know the term "earthing up" this is the method where you put soil over the foliage of the potatoes. This will
